<b>How the IPAC Lapse was identified</b>	Public complaint received on May 8, 2019 regarding a fungal infection of the nails after receiving a service at Soie Nails & Spa.
<b>Summary Description of the IPAC Lapse</b>	Reusable equipment, instruments and work contact surfaces were not being adequately cleaned and disinfected between each use on clients.

<b>Were any corrective measures recommended and/or implemented?</b>	Yes – a preliminary investigation was conducted on May 8, 2019. During this investigation, several violations of Ontario Regulation 136 Personal Service Settings were observed. Some of the infractions noted were corrected during the investigation; others required additional time and a re-inspection was set for the following day. On May 9, 2019 an Order was issued to close the premises.
<b>Please provide further details/steps</b>	The Order set out the following requirements: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Clean and disinfect all reusable instruments, equipment and work contact surfaces in accordance with the Public Health Ontario Guide to Infection Prevention and Control in Personal Service Settings, 3<sup>rd</sup> edition.</li> <li>• Acquire appropriate disinfectants which have been approved by Health Canada for use and are labeled with a DIN (drug identification number) or NPN (natural product number).</li> <li>• Acquire reprocessing equipment suitable for proper cleaning and disinfection of all reusable instruments and equipment that are used in the premises.</li> <li>• Ensure all operators complete infection prevention and control training, to prevent and reduce the risk of disease transmission, provided by Algoma Public Health.</li> </ul>
